J:COM SUBSCRIBER FIGURES (March 2017)

We changed the counting standard for the number of subscribing households of our CATV service starting with the figure for the end of June 2015. Under the new definition, we exclude terrestrial / BS digital retransmission households that were included in the bulk contract for apartment buildings (bulk plan) and other contracts. Instead, we count “only the households installed with our device (set top box) at a charge and watching at least one CS channel” as the CATV subscribing households.

There is no change in standards for counting the high speed Internet access and telephony services. The figures based on the conventional definition will also be disclosed as reference.

*1 Because J:COM has consolidated Oita Cable Telecom Co., Ltd. on June 28, 2016, its subscribers are included in our household numbers. 307,800 households are included in the homes passed, 77,700, 61,700, and 42,700 subscribing households in CATV, high speed Internet access, and telephony, and 109,800 households in the total number of subscribing homes are included respectively. Oita Cable Telecom Co., Ltd. calculates subscribing households using logic different from J:COM Group. In the future when Oita Cable Telecom Co., Ltd. starts applying J:COM 's logic, the above figures may change.

In system operation, J:COM provides cable television, high speed Internet access, telephony, mobile, and electric power service to customers through 28 consolidated subsidiaries at the local level serving 5.29 million subscribing households in Sapporo, Sendai, Kanto, Kansai, and Kyushu-Yamaguchi regions. The number of serviceable households or “homes passed” in J:COM franchise areas is 21.23 million. In channel operation, J:COM invests in and operates 17 thematic channels which are provided to CATV, satellite and telecom operators.
